Growth #13

Jesus summarized the cost of discipleship with a vivid metaphor: "Then Jesus said to his disciples, "If anyone wants to become my follower, he must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Matt 16:24).

Following Jesus isn't just a one-time decision. It's a <u>daily</u> process of growth. The call to spiritual growth is the call to be a disciple of Jesus. It's a call to be more like Jesus. It's a call to submit ourselves to the lordship of Jesus. Spiritual growth is the process of becoming more and more like Jesus Christ. When we place our faith in Jesus, the Holy Spirit begins the process of making us more like Him, conforming us to His image. Spiritual growth is identified by the fruit of the Spirit becoming increasingly evident in a believer's life.

# How do we grow in our faith?

#### 1. The Word

Learning how to grow spiritually is a life-long journey which occurs as you read and apply God's Word to your life. In order for spiritual growth to occur, we must be taught, rebuked, corrected, and trained by God's Word. Then we will be thoroughly equipped for every good work (2 Timothy 3:16-17). We cannot properly honor and serve God unless we have knowledge of His will. We acquire that knowledge through regular, diligent Bible study.

### 3. Trials

Trials can be long, short, emotional, physical, mental, or circumstantial, and come with varying degrees of difficulty. They build into our lives passion, perseverance, and

character change. The Christian always has hope because what may appear as random, is never or unforeseen by the Father in any of the trials that come into their lives. All their pain and trials can have redemptive purposes, and anything that has come into their lives has been allowed by God.

Then there is freedom to experience real healing, forgiveness, and brokenness. We live out our love for God while relating to other people.
