3.	In the middle of the story of Jesus going to heal Jairus's daughter, a woman appears in need of healing. She reaches out to Him, just to touch His clothes. What does this say about faith?
	Jesus tells her that her faith has made her well, that it was true belief in Him.
	Yet in this interlude, Jairus's daughter had died. Jesus goes and performs an even
	greater miracle there. What does this say about Jesus' timing? His plans?
4.	What does it cost Jesus to be involved in your life?
	What does it cost you to be involved with Jesus?
5.	In Nazareth at the beginning of Chapter 6, Jesus faced people who knew Him as the son
	of Joseph. How was this a barrier to their faith?
	Can what we are known as earlier in life serve as a barrier to others? How can you overcome that?
