7.	In the story of blind Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52), before Jesus healed him, He first asked, "What do you want me to do for you?" If Jesus asked you that question, how would you respond?
8.	What will you obey from today's lesson?
9.	Who is one other person you could begin to lead through this discipleship process?
