Prayer

• Prayer is simply communicating with our Father, as Jesus himself did regularly.

Read Luke 5:16

This week we will be looking at what prayer is, why we pray, and even how to pray.

1. So, what is prayer? _____

Prayer is an opportunity to express to the Lord what is on our heart and mind, to seek wisdom and guidance, and to ask for needs to be met. It is also a way to express our praise and adoration of who He is. It includes our asking on behalf of others and praying for what is on God's heart, as well as for His will to be done. Finally, prayer is one way we express our dependence on Him.
